STRESS POSITIONS

Synopsis

Terry Goon (John Early) is keeping strict quarantine in his ex-husband's Brooklyn brownstone while caring for his nephew Bahlul, a 19-year-old model from Morocco, bedridden after an electric scooter accident. Unfortunately for Terry, everyone in his life wants to meet the model. The whole pack of them — including his reckless and outspoken best friend Karla (played by director/writer Theda Hammel) — descend on the dilapidated house, crowding the model, breaking Terry's cherished rules, and putting his barely formed political convictions to the test.

Director's Statement

The youth phase of the hapless millennial generation (to which Terry Goon and I belong) is bracketed by two world historical events — 9/11 on the one hand, and the COVID pandemic on the other. In between? Smart phones, food delivery, and social justice.

Our young model character, Bahlul, is roughly as old as the new millennium. He's a member of the next generation, the one people my age look on with a mix of awe and terror. Why are we afraid? Because they see us for what we are — old, lame, anachronistic.

In a moment of crisis, every little thing is suddenly charged with allegorical significance. Small social interactions seem to stand in for huge historical or familial traumas. The house is falling apart, and so is the world. My husband has abandoned me, and so has the world.

If things can't be interpreted literally — if they refer allegorically to any number of other things — then this proliferation of potential meanings can lead to a kind of vertigo. That vertigo is something all the characters in this movie are feeling. This feeling was especially pronounced during the summer of 2020.

That was four years ago. When we shot the movie, it had been three years, which makes this a sort of period piece. It was not filmed — or written — in the heat of the pandemic. The movie also avoids explicit mention of many of the big banner issues of that moment. Why have I found it necessary to be this oblique?

A character is accused of making an unsavory remark. We never hear her say it. Instead, we hear the phrase ventriloquized by all the people who have a problem with it. In order to call attention to a problem, you have to make a spectacle of that problem. You become a recirculator of horrible words, and horrible images. What follows in this movie is an examination of the problem, not of the character's remark, which is never addressed again.

The problem, as I see it, is a sense of primordial guilt in relation to otherness — and some self-deceiving people's attempts to rid themselves of that guilt. It's impossible to be living today without an awareness of how difficult it is to represent this problem ethically. It's also impossible not to notice that in our attempts to tell stories more ethically, we do not necessarily become better storytellers, or better people.

Another of our characters, the writer, tries her version of ethical storytelling. Suspicious of her own imagination, she commits to writing only what she knows. In the process of narrating her own life, she delivers a frank account of someone close to her, and the resulting portrait is more offensive than anything she could possibly have made up. Later, she is asked why she couldn't have just used her imagination.

A good question for all of us who have come to believe — in our paralyzing and very typically millennial self awareness — that our gaze is suspect, that our imaginations are corrupt, and that we are forever condemned to be voyeurs, tourists, or exploiters of authentic experience.

Theda Hammel / "Karla" / Director / Writer/ Editor / Composer

Theda Hammel is co-host of the KNFW Nymphowars Podcast with Macy Rodman. She has a Masters in Music Technology from NYU Steinhardt and has released three EPs (Very Great, SondHamm, and Partial Magic). Her original music can be found at majortransceleb.bandcamp.com. Her 2021 short film My Trip To Spain starring John Early played at the Sundance and Tribeca film festivals. She is currently in post-production on her feature directorial debut, STRESS POSITIONS, which NEON will finance and distribute, also starring John Early.

John Early / "Terry" / Producer

John Early is an actor, comedian, writer, and producer. His HBO stand-up special, "Now More Than Ever", was released to critical acclaim in June 2023. John is currently nominated for an Emmy award for his A24 sketch special "Would it Kill You To Laugh" co-created with his partner Kate Berlant. He starred in five seasons of the critically acclaimed Max Original dark comedy series "Search Party" and co-starred in the comedy series "The Afterparty" with Tiffany Haddish. He wrote, starred, and executive produced his own episode of "The Characters" and the critically-acclaimed web series "555," also with Berlant. In the New York theater world, he produced a revival of Wallace Shawn's "Marie and Bruce" and directed Jacqueline Novak's hit off-Broadway show "Get On Your Knees." Early's film feature credits include "Neighbors 2," "Beatriz at Dinner," "The Disaster Artist," and "Other People." He can also be seen in "Wet Hot American Summer: First Day of Camp," "Wet Hot American Summer: Ten Years Later," "Broad City," "High Maintenance," "30 Rock," "I Think You Should Leave," "At Home with Amy Sedaris," "Portlandia," and HBO's "Los Espookys."

Qaher Harhash / Bahlul

Qaher Harhash is a Palestinian model and actor currently based in Berlin. Qaher has been featured in campaigns for renowned brands such as Jean Paul Gaultier (alongside Bella Hadid), Prada, H&M, Hugo Boss, and Dolce & Gabbana. The Jerusalem-born Harhash was discovered when he was just 16 years-old, making him one of the first-ever Palestinian male models.

Arlene Muller / Director of Photography

Arlene Muller is a cinematographer who seeks out work that pushes the boundaries of conventional filmmaking and embraces experimentation. She holds an MFA in Cinematography from the American Film Institute, and a BA from the National Film School of Poland in Lodz. Arlene has lensed features, shorts and series which have shown at many festivals including Sundance, SXSW, Tribeca, Clermont-Ferrand, TiFF, and the Berlinale. In 2022, she had two comedy specials nominated for Critics' Choice awards. She speaks fluent Spanish, and is currently in pre-production for a feature in Colombia that was awarded the Colombian Film Fund grant.
